Hello Probus Friends


Another Probus year begins with some new members on our Committee. I was delighted with the response from our members to take a role.

OUR MARCH MEETING

Attendance: 56 present, 19 apologies, 1 non-response, plus 1 visitor.

President: John Chambers opened the meeting by welcoming all members and visitors, and called for any apologies. He acknowledged the passing of Lucille Reubens who died on 15th February, and Jack Andrew, who died on 17th March. Lucille had firstly been a member of the Ladies Group, and continued after the merger. Jack had been a member for sixteen years, and was secretary in 2006/7.John described him as a "Christian Gentleman".

<u>Vice President</u>: Carol Spencer said that there had been a good attendance for the lunch at CB's after the meetings and that they will continue.

<u>Secretary</u>: Catherine Johnson requested that the minutes of the previous meeting be passed and accepted. Various pieces of correspondence were discussed including a resignation from Jan Elliott. Catherine thanked the membership for understanding her idiosyncrasies throughout the year.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Lindsay Gordon advised the members of the current financial position and said that the club was in a healthy state of affairs.

<u>Tours and Outings</u>: Estelle Gold spoke of the Changeover Lunch on Wednesday 22nd March 2017 at Norwood House and mentioned that some members were yet to pay. She also said that there was one place left for the visit to Panorama Gardens. She also asked for expressions of interest for a cruise next year to New Zealand. Mardi spoke of the upcoming events at the Frankston Arts Centre.

<u>Speakers</u>: Neil Gold announced that the April speaker will be Wendy Johnston who will be speaking on 24hour home care. He then introduced James Malone who will be our new officer for Speakers. James asked the members to advise him if there was any particular subject or speaker they would like to hear.

<u>Golf</u>: Graeme Buckley advised that the Ken McArthur Trophy will be played on Monday 3rd April against Melbourne Probus, and that Margaret McArthur will present the trophy to the winning team.

Mellady for our review of the first book of the year, "The Grapes of Wrath"

The book describes the life of a family leaving a drought stricken farm in Oklahoma USA during the depression years, for a better life in California. The group comprises Pa; Ma; six children aged mid-twenties down to age ten; and a couple of "hangers on".

Discussion ensued on the format of the book where chapters alternated between the family's story, and general chapters on the political and civil situation in the USA at the time. Some of the group were distracted by this, wanting to just get on and read the story of the family's difficulties.

The novel is classified as a classic, and we discussed at length what makes a book a classic. The consensus was that the book must have relevance to the public in general, years or even centuries after it was written to be considered a classic. In this case seventy eight years.

In all, a lively discussion with all members contributing.

Speakers:

There was no main speaker today due to the Annual General Meeting. However, **Margaret McArthur** gave a wonderful 10 minute talk entitled **"My Connection with Brazil"**. Margaret and her husband Ken, were very involved in the Student Exchange Programme, and entertained fifty eight students during that time. Five from Arizona, Canada, Japan and Brazil actually lived with them.

The students from Japan and Brazil were a particular challenge, due to the language and cultural differences; however, they have kept in contact with them. They still call Margaret "Mum" forty years on.

Margaret and Ken went to visit one student called **Sergio** and his family in Brazil. Sergio had been a very friendly boy, who got on well with the McArthur children, but was dreadfully homesick and wanted to return home. Communication was limited with Sergio's family; however they seemed to manage with lots of signs, body language and laughs. The father being a Doctor had a good understanding of English.



The family made Margaret and Ken feel very welcome, and they had a wonderful two weeks exploring several cities and experiencing the rich Brazilian culture.

The General Meeting was closed by John Chambers at 10.30am.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING NO.32

The **AGM** commenced after morning tea at 11.00am.

<u>President</u>: John Chambers asked that the minutes of the previous AGM be accepted and signed by the President and Secretary. There were no matters arising. He stated that he would not read the President's Report, as it had been published in the March Bulletin. The report was passed by the members.

Treasurer: Lindsay Gordon announced that an audited copy of the Annual Treasurer's report was available for anyone who was interested. The club has made a loss, which is in line with the budget, in order to bring the bank balance down to sufficient funds to run the club effectively. Funds do not earn interest, so there is no point in holding too much. The goal is to have no more than \$2000 to \$3000. The budget for 2017-18 is also available for perusal. It is based on a membership of 80, with the assumption to break even on events and outings. There are fixed costs that should be covered by member subscriptions. Lindsay moved that the annual subscription be raised to \$50 per year, with the joining fee set at \$20. This was passed by the membership.

<u>Election of Office Bearers</u>: John Chambers announced that all positions were vacant and that there had been one nomination for each.
