
<u>Treasurer</u>: Andy Troy presented the financial report for the month. He also advised that we are still collecting membership subs.

Thursday 10th August a visit to Beleura House \$36 pp for the bus including a light lunch.


Echuca Trip - Expressions of interest are being sought for a three day trip to **Echuca 16th - 20**th **October.**

The next fine dining is on 25th August at Le Bouchon French Restaurant - Address: 10 Russell St, Balnarring VIC 3926. Traditional meals served in a simple space with old-world charm, a cosy courtyard and a casual vibe. Le Bouchon is a style of restaurant in Lyon and Paris serving sweet meats and French Cuisine.

Book Club: The book for the month of May was The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald. "On the surface, *The Great Gatsby* is a story of the thwarted love between a man and a woman. The main theme of the novel, however, encompasses a much larger, less romantic scope. Though all of its action takes place over a mere few months during the summer of 1922 and is set in a circumscribed geographical area in the vicinity of Long Island New York. The Great Gatsby is a highly symbolic



vicinity of Long Island New York, *The Great Gatsby* is a highly symbolic meditation on 1920s America as a whole, in particular the disintegration of the American dream in an era of unprecedented prosperity and material excess. Fitzgerald portrays the 1920s as an era of decayed social and moral values, evidenced in its overarching cynicism, greed and empty pursuit of pleasure". (Notes from www.sparknotes.com/lit/gatsby)

Deb Fleiner as the discussion leader, using notes from the above website, found that there was much to talk about. Fitzgerald cleverly weaves a story, using various themes, imagery, symbols and motifs that in essence create a second, subtle storyline that runs parallel to the main one. Much like *The Plague* by *Camus*, and *1984* by *George Orwell*.

Everyone in the group enjoyed the book and the discussion, which was followed by the usual delicious lunch. Thanks to **Kay Stephens** for giving a report at the meeting.

<u>Induction:</u> President Carol invited John Chambers to introduce Hermann Schneider to the Club, which he showed great delight in doing. He told how Hermann was born in

Switzerland and became a very well-known leading Chef here in Victoria.



President Carol spoke about Probus and its status and our Club sought that new members bring fresh ideas to the Club and help with administration of the Club. She gave Hermann the Probus Club name badge and pin and membership package.

Hermann then introduced himself. He has lived in Mount Eliza and currently lives in Mornington. He was 20 when he came to Australia and had his birthday on the boat. He had a great love of athletics and wanted to participate if he could in the 1956 Olympics. They were looking for cooks at the Olympic Games so

he worked hard there for 15-16 hours each day of the Olympics. He spoke little English but did try to learn it in Frankfurt. His first job of many was at the Chevron Hotel and later opened the Two Faces Restaurant in South Yarra. He achieved many awards. In 1987 he joined a consortium which owned Delgany Estate in Portsea. He married an Aussie girl who was a pillar of strength behind him.

Speakers: Barry Idles Sorrento Catering owner and chef was today's main speaker.

Barry was born in Rochester and is a twin with his brother Ron, who with a 99% conviction rate, is probably one of the best, police officers Victoria and Australia has ever known.

Barry became a chef. He was O'Brien's first apprentice chef and was Victorian apprentice of the year in 1975. He ran a food service at the Cumberland Hotel and first Alfresco Dining in Bendigo. He moved to Swan Hill and won Chef of the Year in 1985 presented by the Australian Wine and Food Society.

He came back to Melbourne and worked at Café Alcaston, and also did private catering for Robert and Janet Holmes a Court, and Robert and Hazel Hawke. Together with his daughter, he created a hugely successful business, the Artistic Catering Company.



They ran the catering at Sydney Myer Music Bowl, Melbourne Zoo, Werribee Open Range Zoo, Healesville Sanctuary, and four International Hotels. He has cooked for many well-known performers and celebrities and has brushed shoulders with Kerry Packer and Dame Elizabeth Murdoch.

Last October he opened the amazing business at Queenscliff Harbour 360Q. Nobody wanted to take on the challenge. He created a marketing campaign and it has grown. He negotiated an arrangement with the Ferry Company so that Probus Members can travel between Portsea and Queenscliff for \$10.00.

"I get bored a lot and started to think about helping others. I support kids in Laos and Hanoi and sponsor their university places. I support the Australian Kidney Foundation. My next thing is WOWh. Wipe Out World Hunger.

Think big. Market yourself Big. Work hard and creatively."

President Carol and James Malone thanked Barry Iddles for a fascinating and motivational talk.
