OUR NOVEMBER MEETING

Attendance: 54 present 15 apologies 3 non-responses 4 visitors

President: Carol Spencer welcomed all members and visitors and acknowledged birthdays. She advised that as several committee members were away, some jobs had been allocated to others. She also mentioned the date change from 1st of December to the 8th for the Christmas Lunch, and that **Bill Lumley**, who was to be the 10 minute speaker in December, had just had a hip replacement, and so another speaker would be required. She appealed to the members for someone to come forward and **Margaret McArthur** obliged.

Carol then invited the members to sing "For they are jolly good fellows" to **Brian and Maxine Coughlan** who have just celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary, and "Happy Birthday" to **Cathy Toft** has celebrated another milestone birthday.(She's not saying which milestone!!)

<u>Vice President</u>: The members were advised that **Brian Mellady** had had an accident and was awaiting hip surgery in hospital.

<u>Secretary</u>: Brian Coughlan proposed that the minutes of the previous meeting be accepted and briefly mentioned the contents of the correspondence received.

Treasurer: Andy Troy advised the club's financial status, and commented that there had been no receipts for the month of October, which was unusual.

<u>Tours and Outings</u>: Deb Fleiner deputizing for Mardi Malone, reminded the members of the change of date for the Christmas Lunch, and that as a result the outing to the Christmas Spectacular at the Frankston Arts Centre would be cancelled. She also gave details of the meal, and reminded members to bring a Kris Kringle present to the value of between \$15 to \$20, clearly marked male or female or both.

The outing to the Goat Dairy farm was a great success, and everyone enjoyed the generous tasting plate and the long leisurely lunch at Montalto.

November 22nd is the date for the ferry crossing and lunch at Queenscliff. Members were advised to meet Mardi at the ferry by 10.45 am for the 11 am crossing, so that they can board the ferry as a group. Also if they required a lift to Sorrento, to contact Mardi by November 16^{th.} John Roberts kindly offered to take someone in his car.

In her role as Bulletin Editor, Deb indicated the Dictaphone that is now being used at the meetings, and is a great assistance for recording the minutes and for composing the bulletin. It picks up everyone's voices beautifully, including the background chatter while people are addressing the membership.

<u>Welfare</u>: Maxine Coughlan advised that Estelle Gold had undergone shoulder surgery and was recovering very well. Bryan Mellady has had surgery for a hip displacement, and Bill Lumley has also been in hospital for a hip replacement. Sadly Norma Binks has passed away after a fall at home.

<u>Speakers</u>: Carol, on behalf of James Malone, advised that the speakers for today were Henry Hammond whose topic was Raffles Hotel, and Andrew Swaine from the Mornington Rail Preservation Society.

<u>House</u>: Jan Marshall thanked Max and Bev Maloney and Maxine for their help with morning tea, and a reminder that there will be a Christmas Lunch at our December meeting.

<u>Golf</u>: Graeme Buckley advised that the next match will be on Monday 26th March 2018. It will be the inaugural match against Probus Central of Mount Eliza and will be at the Frankston Golf Club

Three weeks later on **Monday 16th April** we will be defending the **Ken McArthur Trophy** against **Melbourne Probus**, also at **Frankston Golf Club**.

Brian Coughlan and Peter Long have suggested a challenge match with the Rotary Club of Frankston Sunrise Group, who is a group

of six who play each Monday. Details and arrangements are to be confirmed.

Investment Club: **Max Batchelor** announced that it was time for celebration! The All Ords had passed the 6000 mark. Back in November 2007 it had reached 7000. Over the last ten years it has since dropped by 54%.

The investment group is doing very well, due mostly to the Ladies who are up 22% overall. The Men are up by 8.8%. With dividends the group is up by 13.8%. The most outstanding member is **Diane** whose portfolio is now showing almost 50% profit. The tipping competition for what the All Ords will be on December 31st is going on in the background, and so far **Bob Graham** is leading with 6066.

<u>Fine Dining</u>: Cathy Toft advised that she is in the process of checking out a venue for February 2018. She then called on **Barry Rawlings** to give a report on the outing to 1001 Nights.

Book Club: Jane Long gave a report on the book for October, which was **My Brilliant Friend** by **Elena Ferrante.** Set in Naples in the 1950's, it follows the lives of two girls growing up in the slums amid poverty and corruption. Both excel at school with one staying in the slum area, the other escaping through education. Some of the group liked the book, some found it bogged down with detail, others thought it should be made into a film.



<u>Speakers</u>: Our 10 minute speaker was **Henry Hammond** who spoke about **Raffles Hotel** in **Singapore**, where he was posted in the 1950's. With the aid of old photographs, Henry talked about its origins, its grandeur, and its popularity that still exists today. It was



established by Armenian hoteliers, the Sarkies Brothers, in 1887and was named after British statesman Sir Thomas Stamford Raffles, the founder of Singapore. Henry described how the hotel became the focal point for the ex-pats, and for cruise ship companies to take their guests. He also talked about the famous billiard room, where women were once not allowed. It is evident that Henry has fond memories of Raffles, and was last there in 2004 when he and his wife celebrated their Golden Wedding anniversary.



The main speaker today was Andrew Swaine from Mornington Railway Preservation Society. Andrew gave a brief summary of how the railway network began in Victoria, the reasons behind its inception, and its decline, with the aid of overhead photographs. He then went on to describe how the society was formed and the

reasons why there is a need to preserve steam trains and rail network.

The Mornington Railway Preservation Society (MRPS) was formed out of a public meeting in 1984 with the objective of securing access to the then-closed Mornington railway line. The vision was to reopen it as a heritage railway, focusing on the operation of steam-hauled passenger trains. In 1991 the MRPS was granted a State Government Order in Council, giving access and operating rights to the line, so it could be operated as a heritage railway.

At present the heritage railway runs between Moorooduc station and the completely new Mornington station, which is sited at Yuilles Road in Mornington. This station was opened formally on Sunday 18 April 1999, as just a platform for pullpush working. A run-around loop was added at a later stage. There is an intermediate stop at Tanti Park station. Plans are



for the remaining section of line between Moorooduc station and Baxter station to be restored.

The society has approximately 200 members, with about 50 being active volunteers. There are many plans being mooted, which include extending the rail line and acquiring more trains. Andrew has been involved with MRPS for over 30 years and his enthusiastic and eloquent presentation was well received by the members. **John Fleiner**, a noted train buff himself, gave a vote of thanks and presented Andrew with a bottle of wine.
