Attendance: 55 present 11 apologies 6 non-responses 2 visitors

<u>President</u>: Carol Spencer welcomed all members and visitors and acknowledged birthdays. She spoke of the outings that had recently occurred, and the Christmas Lunch at the Mornington Golf Club. She then proposed one minutes silence in reflection for **Norma Binks**, who sadly passed away last month.

Barry Rawlings then played "Happy Birthday" on the piano for **Carol** whose birthday was on December 14th.

<u>Secretary</u>: Brian Coughlan proposed that the minutes of the previous meeting be accepted and that the **Probarian** was available on the desk out front.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Andy Troy had left his paperwork at home, but explained that the finances were basically the same as the previous month. He also urged the members to vote for the photo competition.





a brief talk on her life in Fiji. She was proudly introduced by her father **John Fleiner**. Megan and her husband decided to escape from their frenetic lifestyle in Sydney by relocating to Fiji, where they have family and 94 acres of land. They wanted to change their way of life, and also expose their children to their Fijian heritage and culture. With the aid of photographs, Megan described some aspects of Fijian life, which included a fish drive, where the community works together to catch as much fish as they can, and is then shared by all who have participated. The members found Megan's talk very interesting and a few questions followed.

Our main speaker today was **Carolyn Pethick** and when she joined Victoria Police in 1982 at the age of 21, she was aggressively informed by her boss in no uncertain terms that he'd never worked with a female, and had no intention of working with a female. He instructed her to stay out of his way and they'd get on just fine.

Since the early 80s, Carolyn was sent to work in many areas where policewomen had never been before such as the Vice Squad. Each time she had to prove women could do the same work as men, without any support or acceptance.

In an effort to end years of sexual discrimination and abuse she submitted a report accusing some her superiors. It was





In 2016 Carolyn retired from the Victoria Police Force after nearly thirty years of service. She enjoyed much of her time during those years and believes that the police force is a great career for women who are now treated as equals to their male colleagues. When she joined, approximately fourteen percent of the police force was women. This number has now grown to about forty percent. Although this book will show some of the horrific conditions some policewomen had to work through during the early years, Carolyn adds that she had some of the greatest times in her life whilst working in the Victorian Police Force.
