<u>Book Club</u>: The book for the month of March was **The Glass Canoe** by **David Ireland** and it did not provide the overwhelming enjoyment like last month's read. The Glass Canoe was simply about the characters that spent their frequent drinking time at their local 'watering hole' - The Southern Cross Hotel, in a working class suburb of Sydney. This was their territory and they were the tribe. We viewed them through the eyes of 'Meat Head' and saw the diversity of characters from the instinctive

fighter, lover, sports statistician (who refused to use his brainpower for money, he held the Stop Go sign for work), follower, leader, philosopher and more. We understand the destructive draw of alcohol on them all. Women are seen as providers of sex or bar maids and are shown no respect. Written in the 70's Ireland introduces them, and we see a stratum of society that was real. We may not enjoy their existence, but it is recorded with skill, admirably descriptive prose and manages to be nonjudgmental.

It was a Miles Franklin award winner which looks for writing that is distinctly Australian.

<u>Speakers</u>: Today's 10 minute speaker was <u>Barry Rawlings</u>, who had prepared a most interesting talk about the history of Probus and about our club. He gave a brief overview of how the first Probus Clubs were formed in England in 1966, where retiring Rotarians wanted to continue their association and fellowship with their friends. He then went on to describe the formation of Mt Eliza Probus Club in 1985, (which was initially for men), under the auspices of Mt Eliza Rotary. Barry has enjoyed his years with the club, and has many fond memories of interesting meetings, fascinating speakers and enjoyable outings. He has also made a huge contribution to the club, and has held various positions, including that of President in 2000/1. Barry continues to be considered a very valuable member and I am sure his continued presence is greatly appreciated by all.





Our main speakers were **Max Bryant and Dave Hoare from the Victorian Maritime Centre (VMC)**. Max Bryant is President of the Victorian Maritime Centre based in Hastings. His talk focused on the vision of his organization which is to establish a world – class exhibit commemorating Australian service at sea in peace and war. The decommissioned submarine HMAS Ottawa was obtained by the VMC and is now on display at Crib Point. The VMC is encountering difficulties in finding a suitable mooring to display the refurbished former pilot ship Wyuna for historical and educational purposes.

David Hoare a retired sub mariner spoke of his experiences

serving on submarines with the Royal Australian Navy.
