Attendance: 59 Present 11 Apologies 3 AWOL 5 Visitors

<u>President</u>: Brian Mellady welcomed the members to the meeting and then paid tribute to Barry Rawlings who passed away on October 30^{th.} A minutes silence was observed. Visitors and birthdays were then acknowledged. He also mentioned that **David Woodlock** had sent a letter of resignation as auditor, and asked if any one would volunteer to take up the position, or perhaps recommend someone.

<u>Vice President</u>: Jane Long mentioned that she had magnetic badges for sale, and that she hoped to have a table at the next Farmers' Market to promote the club, but was having difficulty contacting the person in charge. She thanked **Jan Marshall** for organising the lunch at **Ginseng**.

<u>Book Club</u>: **Deb Fleiner** advised that the book for November was **Tumbledown Manor** by **Helen Brown**.

"Choosing a book from a list containing hundreds of titles (up to a year before), is probably not the best way to pick something that everyone will enjoy. We all have the opportunity to peruse the list and pick out two or three that we fancy. However, you can't have a quick look to see if it "grabs", or in my case, whether you have read it before. Whilst I was reading this book again, my thoughts were that the men in our group probably would view this book as trivial and frivolous, more a "woman's" book.



We all agreed that it resembled a soap opera where every conceivable event that could happen, did happen. It encompasses betrayal, homosexuality, bush fires, country dances, cancer, senility, good will, petulance, and much more. Speakers:

Our 10 minute speaker today was **Jan Marshall**, who along with some choice photos, talked about **Stokes Museum** on **Mount Macedon**, a place that some of us visited several years ago. Her photos included some of the wonderful pieces that Cyril Stokes has collected and of his beautiful gardens. We last saw it in winter when the daffodils were in full bloom, so Jan is hoping to organise another outing to the museum at different time of the year.





Our main speaker was **Dr Larry Wakefield**, a dedicated and passionate bird watcher, who spoke about birds in our backyard. Dr Wakefield, using a very interesting power point presentation, explained that birds need food, water and nesting sites. Mount Eliza has many creeks, parkland areas and gardens that are conducive to attracting a variety of birds that many of us are familiar with, notably Little Ravens, Rainbow Lorikeets and Noisy Minors. If we want to attract birds to our gardens then water sources along with suitable vegetation are very important.. He showed us some beautiful photos of the most common birds to be found, plus some elusive birds that are around but not always seen, especially the pardalotes and the finches. After the presentation some members asked questions which he happily responded to.

Mike Newman standing in for **John Fleiner** introduced Dr Wakefield and also gave the vote of thanks, presenting him with a bottle of wine.
