He joined the Army and moved to Portsea Vic. and attended the Officer Cadet School where he graduated in 1953. He expected to be sent to the Military Battle in Korea, but the situation was settled 2 weeks



before graduation. He was sent to Puckapunyal as Platoon Commander and to Company 21/c later.

After a couple of years he left the regular Army and Joined a company in NSW, Behr Manning. He continued in the citizen Military Forces for a further 8 years. He retired from the army as a captain. He returned to Melbourne to a new position in civilian life. A few months later he was promoted to GM of the company in NZ. He was there for 3 years then came back to Australia as GM and director of Australia, NZ and SE Asia.

A few years later he started his own business which was sold 5 years later. He then went into retirement at 47 years of age and, travelled widely overseas. After that he tried to be a developer which was a bad move and he lost a lot of money and needed to replenish so he started another company with his wife, a company called Rehabilitation Home Help Services. This company was a major supplier of services to Workcover and the Motor Accident Board. Again fully retired he found himself and his wife running a Voluntary charity for mentally Challenged adults.
