and Elizabeth was a successful painter.


They both developed strong relationships with the aboriginal people in the Kimberley Region and

The book created a great deal of discussion and mixed reviews from those present, we also read and discussed written contributions from Wendy, Steve, Lynn and Margaret.

The meeting was followed by a gourmet lunch which was enjoyed by everyone.



Investment: Max Batchelor; Well what a wild old ride we have been having. The ASX All Ordinaries was up marginally today after falling 3.8% from the record high on July 30 a little over a week ago but at 6663.4 it is still up 16.7% on the year so we should all have many reasons to be very happy. Our little group is continuing to outperform the market by almost 50% with a hypothetical capital profit of 23.3% or 24.8% including dividends. Quite amazingly there are no less than 7 members showing a profit greater than 30% continuing to be led, marginally, by Paul up 50.3% closely



followed by David on 49% then Hermann on 40.7%. Even our very conservative group pick is up 37.6%.

In spite of all the good cheer the storm clouds continue to gather on the international scene and there are plenty of doomsayers around in the financial world. Most economies are struggling and virtually every country in the world is battling with massive, record debt including OZ to a slightly lesser degree than many including the US, Germany, Japan, China and the UK. We have Trump at war on the trade front with China and abrogating nuclear missile agreements with Russia. Iraq threatening the flow of 40%

of the world's oil through the Persian Gulf. India taking unilateral action in Kashmir upsetting Pakistan. North Korea demonstrating new missiles, and so it goes. Topping it all with the potential to cause immense problems - climate change! I must say that after writing that I am a bit inclined to join the doomsayers! I do think that even if our market suffers a crash our basics are sound and we should be affected less than most.

Anyhow we can sort a lot of this out on Monday at Norwood House. I know Graeme has been doing some work on his presentation and I am sure he will have something of great interest to cheer us up.

Bob Graham spoke of his background in manufacturing engineering and how technology has radically changed it. Almost all of manufacturing engineering has gone overseas. Certainly, his plea was "Let's get TAFE Colleges back again."

The main crimes in the area are "crimes of opportunity." These are crimes where we provide the opportunity, e.g. unlocked doors.

SNIB your doors. LOCK your doors, windows and security doors.

Use "DO NOT KNOCK" stickers. Those who ignore such stickers have committed an offence. Make sure your car doors are LOCKED. Do NOT leave valuables in cars. Do NOT leave handbags on walkers or trolleys.

Think about where you'd break into your home: SECURE it!

Use SENSOR LIGHTS. Intruders have no wish to be seen. You can even have sensor lights which contain a camera! CCTY can be useful to the police, but it's not the be-all-and-end-all: faces may not be visible but the time of the offence and the offender's clothing may be useful leads.

Aggravated burglaries have increased. Offenders like to get car keys. They enter through unlocked doors and gates.

Scammers use a range of approaches: new love; Centrelink; ATO. Note that Government Offices do NOT call about money. NEVER call back to a number you're given. Do NOT tell anyone the time you won't be at home.

Police Assistance line is 131 444, 000 is for EMERGENCIES ONLY. If something is happening NOW, ring 000. If it happened YESTERDAY, ring 131 444.

DO NOT DEADLOCK THE DOOR, IF SOMEONE IS IN THE HOUSE.
