

Guest Speaker: Bill Spencer

Bill trained as a microbiologist, though he became involved in industrial engineering. He migrated to Australia in 1974.

He took up work in R & D with a cheque-printing company. In 1989 the company was taken over and he resigned rather than wait to be retrenched. His best mates began work on software. in 1991 when the software was nearly ready to go, they invited him to become a partner, which he did, mortgaging his house to buy in. His role was selling "PrintSoft". Bill said that from the beginning it was "born global": the Australian market was too small; the aim always was to create world-wide software.

The first two years were of loss, followed by 13 years of profit.

It was the era when laser printers were coming in. Companies were wrapping and mailing. A new market was opening.

In 1994 they won the Victorian Best New Exporter of the Year Award.

Bill suggested there's a lot of luck in business – being at the right place at the right time.

Before the company sold out to Australia Post it had some 100 staff employed worldwide, including subsidiaries and joint ventures and had a good reputation for a product usable worldwide across the normal linguistic character barriers.

Bill provided a fascinating history of the way a local company could be smart enough to meet the challenges of being a global software company. (John Connan)
