10 Minute Speaker John Connan " A visit to South Africa in 2011 - a pictorial record John presented a series of beautiful photographs of Southern Africa. The trip began at Victoria Falls where John and Ann took a helicopter ride over the falls. They continued to the Okavango delta, where the prolific bird life provided more photos, and on to Namibia and the sand dunes and rock paintings of that country. John was left with the impression that Southern Africa is "In so many ways so like Australia - In so many ways so different"

#### **Guest Speaker:** Anne Connan "My time as World President of the World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women"

Ann began by saying that this was the third time she had spoken to Probus about aspects of her time as World president. Ann was elected in 2011 and served until 2015. She said that she was very surprised to be elected to the position, having thought, perhaps, that she might be elected to be a regional president.

Ann described the structure of the organisation, and went back through history to show how it has grown from modest beginnings to a powerful world-wide body able to effect change for good. She described the work done with young women in developing countries, the scholarships, the mentoring and the development of these young women into able administrators and agents for change.

Ann described the "Wear Black on Thursday" movement that began in Latin America as a protest by Grandmothers over the "disappeared", and grew to protest violence, rape and other crimes against women. Ann described how she wears a black t-shirt each Thursday with a message denouncing violence against women.

Following her presentation, Ann was presented with a token of appreciation by James.

## **Outing to Marengo Redoubt Winery**



On Saturday November 16<sup>th</sup>, we joined with Mornington Probus in a visit to the winery for an afternoon of food, wines and Bees! We were made very welcome by Andy and Ros Thompson. We sampled the three wines on offer, Pino Gris, Chardonnay, and Pinot Noir, while enjoying a selection of canapes, meeting members from Mornington and chatting to each other.

Lunch consisted of a pre-booked choice of Lamb or Salmon, both of which were delicious. This was followed by a selection of cheese and fruits.

After Lunch those who were interested listened to a fascinating illustrated talk by Andy about Bee keeping, while others enjoyed the extensive views around the vineyard.

Andy selected three volunteers to accompany him to the hives for a close look at Bee husbandry. This involved them dressing in protective clothing, which provided some amusement for the rest of us.
