Vale: Bette Wilson

She was very active during her time with Probus, leading sing-alongs, arranging dine-outs, as well as being an active participant in the Investment Group.

Our second Member Profile is also a Life Member. Another interesting story!

Member Profile 2: JOHN ROBERTS

John was born in Ballarat, one of three children. His father was a dentist.

John went to a state primary school but ended his education at Geelong College as a boarder for three years. From school he transferred to Ormond College for five years of dentistry study. Dentistry students had to work Saturday mornings, but two weekends out of three would find John on the road back to Ballarat once classes had finished. His father had a farm near the city, John enjoyed several hours of physical work and a wonderful change from studying!



Once he had qualified, his first job was a year in Northcote working for one of his examiners! At this point he made a decision to go travelling. In 1958 he and his sister Louise set off for Europe, in those days it was always by sea. They began in UK and then went to France where John bought a Deux Chevaux (a Citroën 2 CV) which he deftly moved from country to country in order to avoid paying tax on it! Louise stayed eight months before returning to Australia. John on the other hand found a job, then, in 1961 bought a practice in North London. Initially he lived at the Down Under Club where Rolf Harris was a regular on a Thursday night. Having been plied with several drinks, Harris would begin to sing. He not only had a fund of songs but also various alternative words! He was there for eight to ten years.

Two days after she arrived in England, John met his wife, Johanna. From South Africa, she had worked for three years for the national broadcaster. As she was new and knew no-one John asked if she would like to go to the cinema.... However, she went back to South Africa fulfilling a promise made to her parents. This forced John to propose to her over the phone!

In mid 1961 they married and made use of their time in London going to the theatre at very frequent intervals. They saw John Gielgud and Leo McKern amongst others.

John and Johanna managed two and a half months of holidays each year, they would work, raise the money and then travel. There was only one problem with this arrangement. A replacement dentist had to be found. There were plenty of Australian dentists working as locums in and around London but they often left it until a Thursday before looking for a job the following week. The travel agent was wary of the lack of a confirmed booking but only once were the travellers unable to go.

John finally settled in Mt Eliza in 1976, the house he still lives in. He retired at the turn of the millennium, having joined Probus in 1999. In 2000 he was given the job of welcoming all members and visitors at the door. This he did for twenty years, leading to his award of Life Membership.

The worldwide travels led to his time-consuming hobby: he turns all his holiday films into a travel guide. He has over one hundred CDs, each being over an hour long. Some trips might be on three discs!

When asked which new part of the world he would like to visit, he gave the reply of The Trans-Siberian Railway! Peru and Chile also featured in his thinking. Travelling is in his bones!

Money, he said, is not for saving but better used. We used London effectively!

Unprompted John stated that he had had a wonderful life, with no insurmountable problems until both he and Johanna reached the age of eighty-seven. In his own words: What a gift!


BOOK CLUB:
