Despite the financial world being in a state of flux and near panic following the collapse of some banks in the US and Sweden our members were generally optimistic and upbeat.

Stock markets around the world, including here in Australia, were down. With some notable exceptions, the members in our investment competition followed suit.

The Australian stock market was down almost 5% for the year but under the circumstances the portfolio of member Therese Weiss was doing exceptionally well with an increase of near 16%. The rest of us were following behind with the overall group average down 1.35% for the year.
