O'Shannessy's Carnival of Cherries Tour - 30th November to 4th December 2023

Firstly, before continuing writing about the tour, I would like to thank Liz McDonald on behalf of the 4 intrepid members of Probus Mt. Eliza and several members of the Mornington Probus Club who joined this fully inclusive tour. Liz's research is always second to none and it was such a shame that due to illness she wasn't able to go. This tour was all about "cherries" so on day three 30 of us plus the tour driver and tour director set out to drive to Young - the "Cherry Capital of Australia." This area is the largest cherry growing region in the Southern Hemisphere. Personally, I have never seen so many cherry trees before. After a guided tour of the Young township, we were taken to Allambie Cherry and Plum Orchard. There we had lunch which included dessert - Cherry Pie and Cream.

After lunch we had the opportunity to pick our own cherries.

Despite the emphasis on cherries - there were other interesting inclusions and surprises. There is only room here to mention 2. The **first** was the **Monte Cristo Homestead**. It is a historic homestead located in the town of Junee, NSW. It was constructed by a local pioneer, Christopher William Crawley. The Crawley family remained in residence until 1948. The house then stood empty under the care of several caretakers until 1963, when it was purchased by Reg and Olive Ryan, who have arrested its decay and largely restored it to a habitable condition. The homestead operates as a museum and antiques showcase, and tourist attraction with curio/souvenir shop, advertising itself as "Australia's most <u>haunted house</u>."







The **second** was to meet with **Libby Bailey** of **Rocking Horse Restorations**. During a drought, Libby took up rocking horse restoration to ward off depression when all on the farm had dried up - a true example of country ingenuity. Her knowledge and her drive for perfection was there in her **huge** barn to see. As well as restorations we found an incredible collection of rocking horses dating from the 1870s to the 1990s as well as other historic items such as a grand collection of old farm and hand tools etc. etc. And on the walls of the barn was Libby's remarkable handmade quilts.

After being shown around, we then sat down to enjoy a splendid lunch which Libby had prepared earlier.
