What an adventure we had! How lucky we were to awaken to the most perfect day for our trip on The Tidemaster, organized by Liz McDonald. (I know a few of us thought about the chance that it MIGHT be a terrible wind on Westernport Bay - I know I did).

A bit of carpooling was organized and we arrived in Tooradin for a 11.30 departure to the calmest and sunniest morning.

The first thing everyone saw was a gathering of 150 or so Bikies near our departure point, making parking a premium. Apparently, it is a regular Thursday event for Bikies for a couple of hours and the local cafe does a big coffee trade with the gathering. The Horscrofts enjoyed a delicious breakfast in the cafe. I believe John had delicious pancakes with berries and ice-cream!!!



The Tidemaster was being made ready for us - a husband & wife team, Rachel and Brett who worked so hard the whole day to make it really special for us. We boarded at 11.30 and all 28 of us were seated at already set tables ,with cloths, on board.



As we got underway, tea & coffee were offered by our hostess, Rachel, which I thought was generous of her, as she was very busy preparing our super lunch. We were given a commentary during some of the time it took to motor out into the northern arm of Westernport Bay.

We anchored quite close to Charing Cross Island which is a sanctuary for migratory birds. Mudflats and mangrove swamps support a large number of invertebrates that are an important food source for waders and visiting migratory birds, some of which travel from and return to Siberia.



Here you can see 2 varieties of pelican, black swans and an Eastern Curlew. The bay also supports small numbers of critically endangered birds such as the Far Eastern Curlew, red-necked stints, pied oystercatchers and the vulnerable fairy terns.

We rested in the calm quiet waters of Westernport Bay while our hostess served up a Spit roast of lamb and/or pork, accompanied by 3 delicious salads. Wine was not included but could be purchased if desired. The main course was more than adequate and was followed by a very generous serve of homemade cake & slices.

The Tidemaster is available for groups who can just enjoy a very pleasant day on the water, as we did, or those who want to catch a fish or two, or maybe a wedding or a Bucks party!!! Our captain knew Westernport extremely well and was able to give us a lot of information. It is certainly is a huge expanse of water which one doesn't imagine until out there and seeing the distant shoreline.
