

PROBUS PIGs Update - April 2025 - Graeme Buckley

I would, once again, like to thank Lindsay for his continuing efforts in preparing this year's portfolio.

The market has fallen again this month and is sitting at minus 7.5% from the start of the year. As a group, we are minus 5.9% for the year. So, we are beating the market! In the US, Donald Trump continues to keep the markets on edge with his daily, bewildering tariff statements. Australia was no exception with an overall 10% tariff. His latest 90 day hold on implementing the tariffs (except for China where the tariffs are something like 145%) has only increased anxiety.

His main reason for the backflip on tariffs is that he suddenly realized that China and Japan were the major buyers of US Government bonds and the latest effort to sell billions of US dollars of Government bonds to help with their \$34 trillion debt wasn't going so well!

The only way America can survive is by continually issuing Government Bonds i.e. borrowing money from the rest of the world. They currently run a budget deficit of US\$2 trillion a year! Mind boggling.

As far as our share portfolios are concerned, Carolyn Kent is leading with a 1.2% gain for the year. The best stock in her portfolio is Collins Foods, up 17%. Coming in second is John Fleiner, up 0.4%. His best stock is Sigma, up 14.5%. Third is Jan Marshall, up 0.2%. Her best stock is also Sigma.

Unfortunately, the rest of us are all in the red! While the worst performer shall remain nameless, I suspect he will be getting a bit of stick from his winning wife!
