It follows her life in pre-feminist Adelaide as she marries and raises her family, ever doing her duty in her home and socially until a late-life romance presents at the end!

The book was enjoyed by most of our Readers (although some gave it scores of 3 & 4/10!) and discussion centered around Ruby's various relationships and how they were so very much influenced by the expectations of the times.

Comments summed up the book as "reflective," "relatable" and "an average read with little depth." Our total score was 6.5/10.
